

### **DEVIL MAY CRY**

There has been speculation about Ninja Theory's take on the Devil May Cry franchise for more than a year now, because they decided to reboot the series and gave Dante, the series' protagonist black hair. After playing the game though, I can say, with confidence that you can forget about any hack n slash game you've played before. Whether it's God of War, Metal Gear

Rising, or Darksiders, nothing compares to DmC: Devil May Cry, which has kickstarted 2013 with a bang. The story has you play as Dante, a cocky badassed half-angel, half-demon "Nephilim", who is recruited by his brother Vergil, to take down the demon king Mundus, who runs an organization called the Order, that blinds humans

from the real world, through social media and energy drinks. Mundus was also the one who killed Vergil and Dante's angel mother Eva, and eternally punished their demon father Sparda, amidst the war of angels and demons. The brothers are united after years and decide to kill Mundus and take revenge, but this can only be done through limbo. Dante is able to go into limbo thanks to a human named Kat, who is able to travel between the human world and limbo. Most of the game takes place in limbo, and provides for some gorgeous and jaw-





dropping environments, that
make full use of the different mechanics of the game and Dante's abilities.
Dante is equipped with his sword, Rebellion, and his guns, Ebony and Ivory. Through this journey, Dante is able to learn new abilities with the help of new weapons he discovers. Osiris is giant sickle-like weapon, and Arbiter is a giant axe, which Rebellion simply transforms into when required.
Both weapons come with their own quirks – Osiris allows Dante to hook himself to things – even enemies and hurl himself towards them, whereas


the Arbiter allows him to pull objects and enemies towards him. These

weapons boost the combat. The combat is slick and requires you to think fast and be creative. You are rewarded for how diverse your attacks are and the kind of combos you can pull, which include throwing enemies into the air, pulling them towards you and cutting them up by spinning Osiris. The game's mechanics are pretty solid, and Dante responds well to quick button-mashing. The enemy AI is also fantastic, and will follow you everywhere, which allows you to throw them off a ledge at times. This leaves us with the best hack 'n slash in a while, and a must for action-lovers.






















### **Jokes from the Tamil Tiger**



hil.S and few others made us proud with their tremendous per-


